

## Juvenile Justice

See also: **Psychology, Social Work, and Sociology.**

### I. Purpose:

To support teaching and research to the BS degree in Criminal Justice, the BS degree in Criminal Justice with a specialization in Juvenile Justice, the BS degree in Psychology, to the MS level in Juvenile Justice, MS level in Juvenile Forensic Psychology, the PhD level in Juvenile Justice, and the PhD. Level in Clinical Adolescent Psychology. Many of these concerns are shared with other disciplines and departments on campus, including Psychology, and Sociology.

The purpose of this plan is to develop a collection that supports the undergraduate and graduate curriculum and research in the field of juvenile justice, including doctoral studies. Strong emphasis is given to the acquisition of materials necessary for research by members of the academic community whose focus is in the area of juvenile justice.

### II. General Collection Guidelines:

**A. Languages:** English is the primary language of collection. In order to support research in the PhD programs, the library will purchase selected works published in non-English languages in the original and in English translation. The Library selectively acquires the original texts of the writings of major psychologists, no matter what the language, in order to support research and instructional needs.

**B. Chronological Guidelines:** Primary emphasis is on the twentieth century, especially contemporary conditions. Chronological periods covered by the collections in terms of intellectual content, movements, or schools are emphasized by collecting current or recent theory. Historical sources are also considered.

**C. Geographical Guidelines:** Emphasis is on published works in the United States. There is, however, an increasing interest in cross-cultural studies, which are selectively acquired. Therefore, core resources will be considered when they support a global perspective. The following subcategories would be appropriate for worldwide geographic treatment: areas of administration; sociological theory of crime; penological theory; and juvenile delinquency.

**D. Treatment of Subject:** Special emphasis is placed on scholarly treatment for books and journals. However, technical and professional treatments of the subcategories administration and penology are especially significant. Electronic services are crucial sources.

**E. Types of Material:** Emphasis is placed on the aggressive collecting of book/monograph types of material in all categories on juvenile justice, serials and journals, and electronic sources such as databases. Other formats considered for acquisitions include: loose-leaf services, documents (federal, state, and local), case reporters and digests. The library also collects reprint editions, microfiche editions, and collections of personal papers. The library also collects selectively in manuscripts and rare materials that would be of interest.

**F. Date of Publication:** Emphasis is on current materials, but older works of historical significance are acquired.

**G. Special Parameters:** An interdisciplinary orientation for juvenile justice is followed in the development and collection of library materials.

**H. Collection Development Goals:**

1. Continue current aggressive acquisition methods for books and monographs, directories, bibliographies, and compendia to support undergraduate and graduate assignments.
2. Greatly develop journal titles in the Juvenile Justice Collection for appropriateness/representation of current curriculum needs for both undergraduate and graduate students.
3. Identify and greatly strengthen monograph collection in all areas of juvenile justice, including the areas of substance abuse, penology, and crimes and offenses.
4. Actively evaluate and acquire relevant electronic juvenile justice sources.
5. Identify lists of publications held or offered by other academic libraries and evaluate for inclusion in our collection.
6. Continue the commitment to provide remote access to juvenile justice electronic resources maintained in the library.
7. Ensure that the collection provides best possible access to relevant Federal and State statutory, Federal and State Regulatory, and Federal and State case law, and the relevant commentary to this law.
